

ESCB 1 MINUTE GUIDE

There are **seven** agencies in Essex who are jointly responsible by law for keeping children safe. These are called the **Statutory Partners** and they are the key decision makers who form the ESCB Executive and are responsible for the direction of travel (with identified relevant partners).

The work of the Board is carried out by the **sub-committees, stay safe groups and task and finish groups.**

The **voice of the child** and family will regularly be heard by using existing service user panels, school councils and youth groups.

CHILD SAFEGUARDING PRACTICE REVIEWS (CSPR)

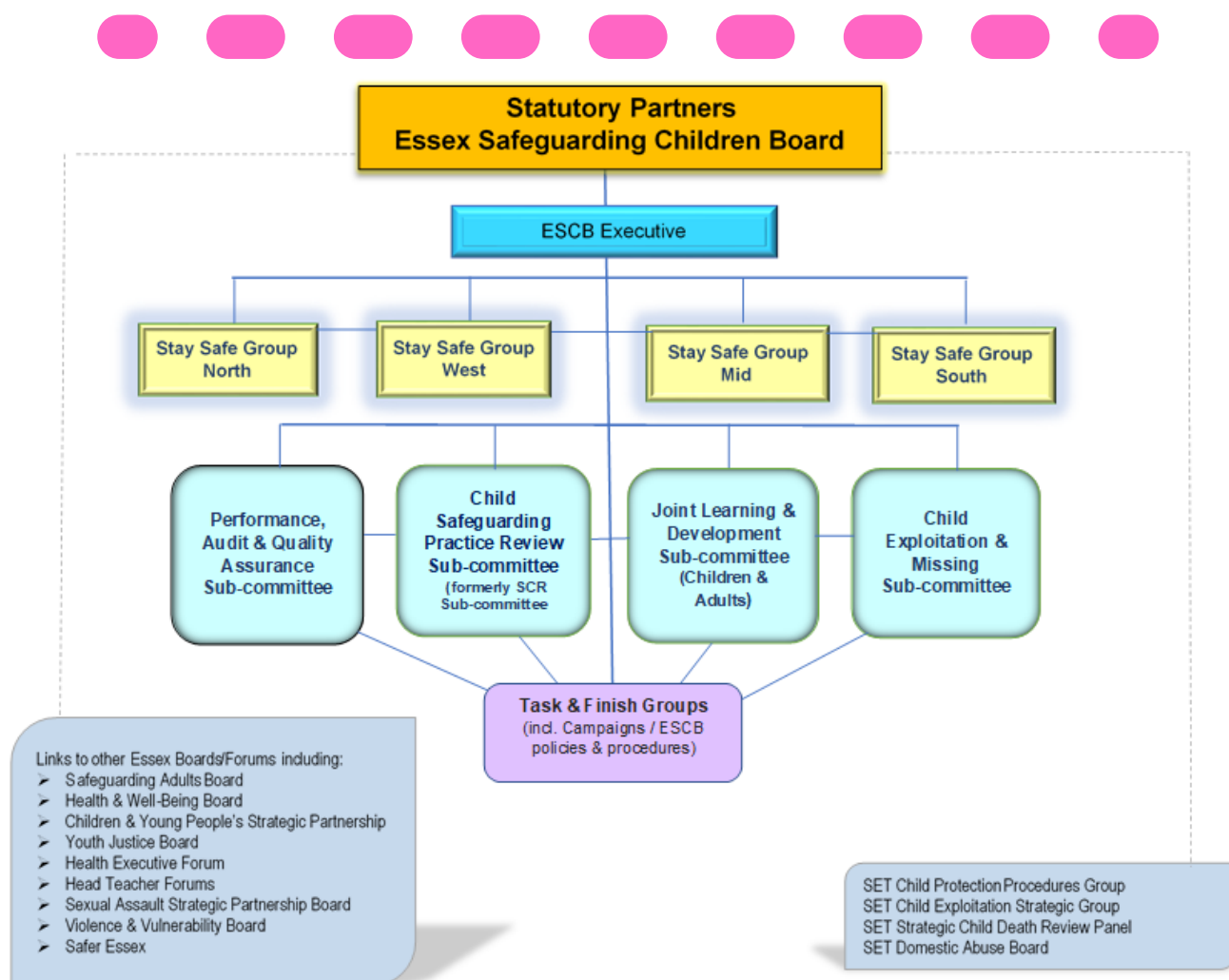
These used to be called Serious Case Reviews and their purpose is to look at the involvement that organisations and professionals have had with a particular family or child.

A review is carried out when a child dies or is seriously harmed and abuse or neglect is suspected.

These reviews help us identify what agencies need to do to improve the way they work together to safeguard children in Essex, and ultimately prevent or reduce the risk of similar incidents happening again.
