Quarterly Essex Water Safety Forums, with representatives from

Training

Launch of Royal National Lifeboat

Institution (RNLI) Waterside Responder Scheme providing specialist training to hospitality and security staff in how to deploy a throwline to help prevent drownings.

23 people have been trained by Essex County Fire and Rescue Service (ECFRS) to date

25 Essex ActivAte club organisations trained by the RNLI

enabling them to deliver water safety messages and advice as part of the Essex ActivAte programme (**42 individuals from 25 Essex ActivAte club organisations** trained by the RNLI, **19 of which delivered water safety workshops to 725 children** across Basildon, Castle Point, Chelmsford, Colchester, Epping, Maldon, Rochford, Basildon, Tendring, Thurrock and Uttlesford as part of the Essex ActivAte summer programme).



Events

ECFRS staff attended over 60 water safety events across Essex, engaging with over

5,000

people to deliver water safety messaging

Essex and South Suffolk Community Rail Partnership organised

2 'seaside special' trains in the summer holidays running from Colchester to Walton.





These were attended by 296 people (of which 162 were children). **ECFRS and RNLI** engaged with 650 people across the two events.

ECFRS delivered **4** water safety workshops to
